

Fantasy Snooker Series

Tournament Rules and Conditions

1. By entering the tournament, you are agreeing to these rules and conditions.
2. The tournament is open only to Citizens and Permanent Resident of Singapore.
3. Your entry is only valid when you have registered and have also paid the entry fee.
4. A player may withdraw from the event BEFORE entries close and receive a refund of the entry fee (after deduction of relevant gateway and bank fees for all payment types). There will be no refunds after entries have closed.
5. Entries close for each event at 11.59 pm on the date provided in the tournament announcement.
6. Guaranteed Prize Pool for each tournament: \$4000 (winner \$1000, Runner-up \$600, Semi-finalists \$400, quarter finalists \$200, last 16 \$100).
7. Players in each of the three events will earn Fantasy ranking points. The eight (8) players with the most points will be invited to compete in the play-offs towards the end of the year: Prize pool \$2500 (winner \$2000, runner-up \$200, semi-finalists \$100, quarter-finalists \$25). The format for the end of year play off will be ONE FRAME SHOOTOUT, all played on one day.
8. Subject to entry numbers, the top 8 seeds may be given byes into the last 32 stage. The national rankings will be used. The remainder of the draw will be drawn randomly using a random list generator.
9. The draw will be published as soon as possible after entries close. Once published, there can be no alterations or substitutions to the draw.
10. For each tournament play will commence on the Saturday at 10.30 am and continue on the Sunday at 10.30 am, with no player playing more than 2 matches each day. On the second Saturday we will play Last 16 and quarter-finals. On the second Sunday we will play semis and the final. After the first round of matches, all matches will roll-on as soon as tables become available. Winners need to be available for their next match when it is called – do not leave the venue without permission from the Tournament Director. Rossa reserves the right to amend this schedule if necessary due to entry numbers.
11. Players who cannot be located within 10 minutes of their match being called will forfeit. The tournament director has discretion to vary this if circumstances require more latitude.
12. Matches up to the semi-final stage will be self-refereed but roving referees will be available.
13. Dress Code: Long trousers or jeans, covered shoes. For streamed finals, players must wear a Rossa polo, which will be provided free of charge.
14. When your match is called, collect the match score sheet from the Tournament Director and proceed promptly to the designated table.
15. Each player is permitted a few practice shots to gauge the pace of the table.

16. RoSSA's usual rule for automatic frame concession when three snookers are needed does NOT apply to this sanctioned national ranking event, but players are encouraged to be sensible when many snookers are required.
17. The tournament will be played by the rules laid under World Professional Billiards and Snooker Association. In the absence of a referee officiating the match, the "foul and a miss" rule will be applied up to a maximum of 2 times. Beyond that, the incoming player shall play from the final rest position of the balls or ask his/her opponent to play the shot. Once point difference is more than the points remaining on table, foul and a miss rule shall no longer apply.
18. For matches presided over by a referee, the referee has the right to apply the "foul and a miss" rule based on his/her discretion. In such a case, there will not be a limit to the number of times in which the rule may be applied.
19. When the match is finished, please vacate the table area quickly so that the next match can start.
20. The winner has the responsibility to return the completed score sheet to the Tournament Director.
21. All organisers and participants shall comply with and abide by the 2021 World Anti-Doping Code as may be revised from time to time by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and to comply with the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions.
22. All organisers and participants agree to abide by the Safe Sport Unified Code and to comply with the applicable rules under the Safe Sport Guideline.
23. On any matter not covered by these rules, the Tournament Director has complete discretion to make a decision in the interests of fairness. No debate will be entered into.
